Attorney Moulton further stated, it is his intent that he can get this to the Supervisor and his attorney by next week and will email to each of the Board Members and ask if the resolution is in a form acceptable to everyone and so it can be approved. If not, let Attorney Moulton know, but the intent is, because we don't have the final version of the resolution in front of us, but we want to make it effective at the Board Meeting tonight rather than call a special meeting, or wait until the September regular meeting; it would be effective upon the signatures of the majority of the Board members once it is circulated.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF FLUSHING GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN RESOLUTION NO. 15-21 RESOLUTION RESTRICTING SUPERVISOR'S AUTHORITY

Whereas, Teamsters Local 214 (Union) has submitted three (3) grievances (copies of which are attached and incorporated by reference) to Flushing Township (Employer) alleging conduct on the part of Supervisor Rian Birchmeier in violation of the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) in effect between the Union and Employer;

Whereas, the Supervisor, through his attorney, has submitted written responses to the Grievances:

Whereas, Employer's Personnel Director has investigated the grievances, including consideration of the Supervisor's responses and, with the assistance of the township attorney, submitted a summary to Employer's Personnel Committee;

Whereas, the Personnel Committee met with the Union representatives and Supervisor on August 7, 2015, to review the summary and discuss possible resolution of the grievances, to which the Supervisor refused participation;

Whereas, Employer's Board of Trustees, with required notice, met in closed session during its regular meeting of August 13, 2015, to consider the pending grievances, including the Supervisor's responses;

Whereas, a majority of the Board of Trustees, including the Supervisor, has determined it would be appropriate and in the best interest of the Township and its employees to resolve the grievances in accordance with the proposal made by the Union and, therefore;

IT IS RESOLVED:

- 1. Effective with the adoption of this Resolution, and except as stated below, all authority conferred to the Supervisor, including but not limited to the duties enumerated in MCL 42.10, are reserved to the Board of Trustees and, until further action of the Board, are assigned to the Township Treasurer, who is designated acting Township Superintendent. Any Township policy or procedure designating the Supervisor to act on behalf of the Township is rescinded pending further Board action.
- 2. With adoption of this Resolution, the Supervisor shall have no authority with respect to any Township employee and the Township Treasurer, in the current capacity as Personnel Director, shall be the chief administrative officer with respect to all Township employees, including Police Personnel. Any reference to "supervisor" in any collective-bargaining agreement between Employer and Union or any other agent for any Township employee shall mean the Personnel Director.
- 3. The Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor shall not be present at the Township offices from 8 AM-6 PM, Monday-Thursday, and shall only be present as reasonably necessary to conduct the limited duties reserved to the Supervisor under the Michigan Constitution and statutes, including voting on matters presented to the Township Board; chairing the meetings of the Board of Trustees; serving as Township emergency manager and as the Township's designated agent for service of process.
- 4. The Supervisor shall have no contact with Township employees and shall not communicate with Township employees including by telephone, email or regular mail except as is reasonably necessary to perform the duties reserved to the Supervisor, identified in Paragraph 3 of this Resolution. This provision shall not prohibit contact between the Supervisor and Township employees incidental to the Supervisor's activities as a Township resident or member of the general public.
- 5. On or before August 31, 2015, the Supervisor shall vacate the office which he currently occupies and return to the office currently occupied by the Finance Director, who shall occupy the office now occupied by the Supervisor. The Supervisor shall remove his personal property from his current office and shall be responsible to move the furniture and equipment from his current office. Township shall be responsible to move the furniture, equipment, and other items now located in the office occupied by the Finance Director.
- 6. On or before August 31, 2015, the Supervisor shall return to the Clerk the Township cell phone and credit card and all keys to township facilities, vehicles or equipment, except the key to the Township office building and the specific office to be occupied by the Supervisor.
- 7. The Supervisor shall continue to receive his customary salary through the end of the current elected term.
- 8. Township shall make such adjustments as necessary to cause all emails and voicemails received at the Supervisor's work email and office telephone extension to be redirected to another employee's email address and telephone extension, as determined by Township.
- 9. All packets or information to be provided to board members in anticipation of a regular or special township board meeting shall be delivered to the Supervisor's residence by a

member of the Flushing Township Police Department at such times as required by township policy.

10. This Resolution shall be binding only in the event, upon its adoption by the Charter Township Board of Trustees. Teamster's Local 214 withdraws the grievances dated May 19,

An ordinance to amend certain provisions of the sign ordinance, Chapter 13.5 of the Code of Ordinances, to a designate the sign ordinance as Article 400-A of the Zoning Ordinance; to provide for the designation of an authorized official in the

absence of a building inspector; to define political sign; to amend Section 13.5-62 to allow political signs on all private property and to specify the time for the removal of political signs; and, to define "direct and indirect illumination"; and to define and regulate Farm Signs and Roadside Stand Signs..

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF FLUSHING ORDAINS:

Chapter 13.5 of the Code of Ordinances "the Sign Ordinance" is amended as follows:

1. As the Sign Ordinance was adopted as part of the Charter Township of Flushing Zoning Ordinance, the Sign Ordinance, currently Chapter 13.5 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby redesignated as Article 400-A of the Zoning Ordinance and the existing sections of Chapter 13.5 are designated as follows:

2. Section 13.5-28, redesignated Section 20-400 A-3, is amended to add the following:

"Directly or indirectly illuminated" means, unless otherwise expressly stated, to be lighted by a stationary light source emitting a constant white light.

"Farm sign" means a sign erected on a premises where agricultural products are grown, raised, harvested or prepared for sale, which advertises the sale of the agricultural products at the premises.

"Indirectly illuminate" means illuminated with a light source so shielded as to illuminate only the surface of the sign.

"Political sign" means a sign relating to the election of a person or persons to public office or relating to a political party or relating to a matter to be voted upon at an election called by a public body.

"Roadside Stand Sign" means a sign erected at a roadside stand or which advertises the location of a roadside stand. A roadside stand sign shall be limited to advertising the name of the stand, the agricultural products offered for sale, prices and hours of operation.

- 3. Section 13.5-57, redesignated Section 20-400 A-19 is amended by adding the following as new subsections (d) and (e):
 - (d) On premises used to grow, raise, harvest or prepare agricultural products for sale there shall be permitted one (1) non-illuminated farm sign not to exceed 12 square feet.
 - (e) On premises used to grow, raise, harvest or prepare agricultural products for sale on which there is located a roadside stand or with respect to an off-site roadside stand, there shall be permitted one (1) on-site and two (2) non-illuminated roadside stand signs not exceeding four square feet. Prior permission shall be obtained from the owner of any property on which a sign is posted. The signs shall be temporary and shall be removed at the close of the period of permitted operation of the roadside stand.
- 4. Section 13.5-62(1), redesignated Section 20-400 A-25(1) is amended, by deleting the existing language and replacing it with the following:

All temporary signs, except political signs, must bear the name and address of the person causing the sign to be erected. No temporary signs are permitted in the public right-of-way.

(1) There shall be permitted in all districts, non-illuminated political signs not exceeding twelve (12) square feet in area and four (4) feet in height. Signs must be removed within fourteen (14) days after the election for which they are erected.

Except as expressly amended, the remaining provisions of Section 13.5-62, redesignated Section 20-400 A-25 remain unchanged.
